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Spoštovani ljubitelji glasbe,

zvesta publike Festivala Ljubljana vsako jesen z radovednostjo pričakuje ponudbo mednarodnega glasbenega cikla Mladi virtuozi, ki letos vstopa že v 23. sezono. Festival Ljubljana na teh koncertih predstavlja mlade umetnike, ki večinoma v prihodnjih letih odmenvno zaznamujejo glasbeni svet.

Kot vsako leto pridejo umetniki iz tujine, poleg njih pa bomo lahko prisluhnili tudi odličnim in vse bolj uveljavljenim domačim glasbenikom, dobitnikom nagrad s pomembnih glasbenih tekmovanj.

Cikel bosta odprla srbska glasbenika, kitarist Vojin Kocić in violinist David Horvat, ki sta se šolala pri najboljših pedagogih v tujini.

Na novembrskem koncertu bomo prisluhnili slovenski harfistki Evi Tomšič, ki se trenutno šola na Kraljevem konservatoriju v Bruslju, in fagotistu Luki Mitevu, ki sodeluje z orkestri doma in v tujini in je zmagovalc nekaterih tekmovanj, sodeloval pa je tudi v poletni šoli Evropskega mladinskega orkestra.

Todor Marković stopa po očetovih stopinjah in se razvija v odličnega kontrabasista. Letos je bil najmlajši član spomladanske in poletne turneje Mladinskega orkestra Gustava Mahlerja, ki po kakovosti sodi v vrh evropske orkestrske ponudbe. Na koncertu bo poleg Markovića zaigrala tudi Jana Fridau, študentka Akademije za glasbo in ena perspektivnejših slovenskih kitarist.

Na januarskem koncertu bomo prisluhnili basbaritonistu Philippu Kranjcu, ki je avstrijsko-slovenski korenin in začenja svojo glasbeno kariero v nemških opernih gledališčih ter Anni Magdaleni Kokits, ki je ena najobetavnejših pianistk v Avstriji.

Naslednji bo na vrsti nastop večkrat nagrajenega kontrabasista Grega Rusa in Rannveig Marte Šarc, ki se šola na eni najprestižnejših ustanov, newyorkški šoli Juilliard.

Na šestem koncertnem večeru se bomo seznanili z zanimivo zasedbo harfe in kitare, za katero sta se odločila mlada umetnika Anastazija Razvalajeva in Miklós Környei, ki sta se spoznala na Akademiji za glasbo v Budimpešti in v tej zasedbi skupaj nadaljujeta glasbeno pot. V drugem delu koncerta bo nastopil harmonikar Dragan Ribić, ki prihaja iz Bosanskega Petrovca, od leta 2013 pa živi v Nemčiji, kjer je študent podiplomskega študija na Visoki šoli za glasbo v Detmoldu.

Na zadnjem koncertu cikla Mladi virtuozi se bo predstavil Sebastian Bertoncelj, ki že nekaj let s sijajnim igranjem violončela vzbuja pozornost našega in vedno bolj tudi mednarodnega glasbenega okolja. Poleg mladega violončelista bo na sklepнем koncertu nastopil Pihalni kvintet Anemos, ki prihaja iz Furlanije in se zlasti v severni Italiji vse bolj uveljavlja, njegov mentor je Paolo Calligaris, sicer solist fagotist v Orkestru Slovenske filharmonije.

V mednarodnem glasbenem ciklu 2015/16, ki ga bo v celoti posnel Radio RTV Slovenije, bodo nastopili mladi umetniki, ki si uspešno utirajo pot v svetovni glasbeni svet in so s svojim delom že dokazali veliko kakovost.

Vljudno vabljeni, da jim prisluhnete, pri čemer vam želimo mnogo umetniških užitkov.

Dear music lovers,

Each autumn, the festival's loyal audience is curious to see the forthcoming concerts from the international Young Virtuosi Music Cycle. As part of the cycle, which is now already in its 23th season, the Ljubljana Festival will feature young artists who are expected to gain prominence in the years to come.

Like every year, the audience will be able to attend performances by foreign artists as well as excellent and increasingly successful Slovene musicians who are winning awards at important music competitions.

The cycle will be opened by the guitarist Vojin Kocić and the violinist David Horvat from Serbia, who were educated abroad by the best teachers.

November's concert will see Slovene harpist Eva Tomšič on stage, who is studying at the Royal Conservatory of Brussels, and the bassoonist Luka Mitev, who plays in orchestras both at home and abroad and is the winner of several competitions. He also took part in the European Union Youth Orchestra's summer school.

Todor Marković is following in his father's footsteps and is developing into a formidable double bassist. This year, he was the youngest member on the Gustav Mahler Youth Orchestra's spring and summer tours, which is one of the leading orchestras in Europe. Jana Fridau, a student at the Academy of Music and one of Slovenia's most promising guitarists, will also perform on the concert.

The concert in January will feature Philipp Kranjc, a bass-baritone of Carinthian Slovene descent, who is embarking on his musical career in German opera houses and Anna Magdalena Kokits, who is today considered as one of the most promising pianists in Austria.

This will be followed by the performance of the award-winning double bassist Grega Rus and Rannveig Marta Šarc, who is a student at one of the world's most prestigious institutions, the Juilliard School in New York.

The sixth musical evening will present an interesting duet of harp and guitar played by young artists Anastasia Razvalyaeva and Miklós Környei. They met at the Liszt Ferenc Academy of Music and have performed together ever since. The second part of the concert will feature the accordion played by Dragan Ribić from Bosanski Petrovac, Bosnia and Herzegovina. He has lived in Germany since 2013 where he is a postgraduate student at the Hochschule für Musik Detmold.

The last concert in the Young Virtuosi cycle will feature a number of musicians, including Sebastian Bertoncelj, whose brilliant cello performances have already caught the attention of domestic and foreign music connoisseurs, and the Anemos Wind Quintet from Friuli, Italy. Mentored by Paolo Calligaris, the bassoon soloist for the Slovenian Philharmonic Orchestra, the quintet is increasingly acclaimed especially in northern Italy.

The 2015/2016 international music cycle, which will be recorded by RTV Slovenia, will present young artists who have already worked hard to prove their abilities and are now taking their first steps into the global music scene.

You are kindly invited to attend the concerts and enjoy the pleasure of experiencing their music.

Vojin Kocić je bil rojen v Smederevu 1990. Leta 2013 je diplomiral na Visoki šoli za umetnost v Zürichu, zdaj pa je študent podiplomskega študija na isti šoli v razredu Andersa Miolina.

Do danes je igral na več kot petdesetih solističnih koncertih, kot solist in z orkestri. Je nosilec prve nagrade društva ArtLink

leta 2010, ki mu je med drugim omogočila koncert v Parizu. Je prejemnik prvih nagrad na nekaterih srbskih in mednarodnih tekmovanjih v Weimarju, Velbertu, Splitu, Beogradu, Italiji in Avstriji. Je tudi dobitnik nagrade za najperspektivnejšega mladega glasbenika v Švici.

Vojin se nenehno izobražuje pri mednarodno priznanih kitaristih, kot so Oscar Ghiglia, Hubert Kappell, Pepe Romero, Costas Cotsiolis, Pavel Steidl, Leo Brower, Zora Dukić, Duško Bogdanović in drugi.



David Horvat je bil rojen leta 1997 v družini poklicnih glasbenikov na Nizozemskem. Ko mu še ni bilo sedem let, se je družina preselila v Srbijo, kjer se je začel učiti violino na Šoli za glasbene talente v Čupriji. Že drugo leto šolanja je zaradi izjemne nadarjenosti začel javno nastopati doma in v tujini kot solist s šolskim orkestrom. Med štiriletnim učenjem je David prejel vrsto domačih in mednarodnih nagrad, med katerimi je najpomembnejša prva nagrada na mednarodnem tekmovanju Jaroslav Kocijan v Usti na Orlici na Češkem 2007. Jeseni 2008 je po odlično opravljeni avdiciji postal učenec slovite mednarodne Menuhinove šole v Londonu, ki mu je tudi podelila štipendijo za šolanje. V sedmih letih študija je mladi umetnik dosegel ogromen napredok v violinski igri in s svojim delom odlično izpolnjuje visoke zahteve pedagogov, zato kot predstavnik šole veliko nastopa bodisi kot solist bodisi s šolskim orkestrom v Angliji in drugih državah, hkrati pa se izpopolnjuje na seminarjih pri priznanih violinskih pedagogih. Decembra 2014 je prejel nagrado za najperspektivnejšega mladega umetnika v Srbiji, ki mu jo je podelilo mednarodno društvo ArtLink Srbija.

Davida Horvata bo pri klavirju spremiljal **Uki Ovaskainen**, ki je bil rojen leta 1975 v mestu Espoo na Finskem. Študiral je na sloviti Akademiji Sibelius v Helsinkih in na Danski kraljevi akademiji v København in tu z odliko diplomiral, podiplomski študij pa je opravil na Visoki šoli za glasbo v Hannoveru. Uki Ovaskainen koncertira kot solist in komorni glasbenik v vsej Skandinaviji, Nemčiji, Avstriji, Izraelu, Španiji, Rusiji, Srbiji in na Hrvaškem. Je tudi dobitnik nekaterih mednarodnih nagrad. Od leta 2001 je korepetitor na oddelku za godala na beograjski Fakulteti za glasbo.

Vojin Kocić was born in Smederevo in 1990. In 2013 he graduated from the Hochschule der Künste in Zürich and is currently a postgraduate student at the same institution, where he is studying under Anders Miolin.

To date Vojin has performed at more than 50 solo concerts, both as soloist and with orchestras. As the winner of the ArtLink award for Most Promising Young Musician in 2010, part of his prize was the opportunity to perform in Paris.

He has won first prizes at a number of Serbian and international competitions: in Weimar, Velbert, Split and Belgrade, as well as in Italy and Austria. He has also won the Prix Credit Suisse Jeunes Solistes.

He has studied with many internationally acclaimed guitarists, including Oscar Ghiglia, Hubert Kappell, Pepe Romero, Costas Cotsiolis, Pavel Steidl, Leo Brower, Zora Dukić and Duško Bogdanović.

David Horvat was born in the Netherlands in 1997, into a family of professional musicians. Before his seventh birthday the family moved to Serbia, where he began studying the violin at the School for Musically Gifted Children in Čuprija. His remarkable talent was soon evident and in just his second year he began performing as a soloist with the school orchestra, both in Serbia and internationally. Over the course of four years David won a series of national and international prizes, the most important of which was first prize at the international Kocjan Violin Competition in Ústí nad Orlicí (Czech Republic) in 2007. In the autumn of 2008, following an excellent audition, he became a student of the famous Menuhin School in London, which awarded him a scholarship. In seven years of study the young musician has made enormous progress as a violinist and continues to meet the exacting demands of his teachers. He frequently represents the School in performances, both as a soloist and with the School orchestra, in England and abroad. At the same time he regularly attends the seminars of famous violin teachers. In December 2014 David Horvat won the ArtLink Serbia award for Most Promising Young Musician.

David Horvat will be accompanied on the piano by **Uki Ovaskainen**, who was born in Espoo in Finland in 1975. He studied at the famous Sibelius Academy in Helsinki and at the Royal Danish Academy of Music in Copenhagen, graduating from the latter with distinction. He completed postgraduate studies at the Hochschule für Musik und Theater in Hanover. He is active as a soloist and chamber musician and has performed concerts throughout Scandinavia and in Germany, Austria, Israel, Spain, Russia, Serbia and Croatia. He has won a number of international prizes. Since 2001 he has worked as a répétiteur for strings at the Belgrade Faculty of Music.

tekmovanja Svirél v kategoriji brenkal, zadnji uspeh pa je dosegla na državnem tekmovanju mladih glasbenikov TEMSIG 2015, kjer je prejela prvo nagrado in posebno nagrado Festivala Ljubljana in Slovenske filharmonije. Konec letosnjega leta se bo udeležila

Eva Tomšič je bila rojena leta 1995 v Ljubljani in se je pri šestih letih na Glasbeni šoli Koper začela učiti harfo pri Lučki Joksić. Ko je vstopila na Umetniško gimnazijo v Kopru, je šolanje nadaljevala pri Anji Gaberc. Od leta 2013 je študentka harfe pri Jani Bouškovi na Kraljevem konservatoriju v Bruslju v Belgiji.

Na regionalnih, državnih in mednarodnih tekmovanjih je osvojila več nagrad in zlatih plaket. Aprila 2013 je bila zmagovalka mednarodnega

mednarodnega tekmovanja v Izraelu, ki velja za eno najprestižnejših tekmovanj za harfo.

Eva se izpopolnjuje na številnih mojstrskih tečajih pri priznanih pedagogih, obenem pa vedno več koncertira. Decembra 2013 jo je mednarodna žirija Svetovnega harfističnega kongresa izbrala za izvedbo samostojnega koncerta v okviru programa Focus on Youth na srečanju te ustanove julija 2014 v Sydneyju v Avstraliji. Sicer pa je nastopila v Veliki Britaniji, Srbiji, Italiji, Franciji, Belgiji in na Hrvaškem. Eva Tomšič je tudi članica različnih orkestrov in je igrala pod vodstvom priznanih domačih in tujih dirigentov.



Dijak 4. letnika Konservatorija za glasbo in balet Ljubljana **Luka Mitev** je bil rojen leta 1997 v Postojni in hodi po stopinjah svojega očeta, tudi svojega prvega učitelja, prizanega fagofista Zorana Miteva. Že pri dvajstih je nastopil kot solist s Pihalnim orkestrom Logatec.

Luka je dobitnik zlatega priznanja na regijskem tekmovanju TEMSIG 2010, zlate plakete in prve nagrade na državnem istoimenskem tekmovanju, enake nagrade na istoimenskem tekmovanju tri leta pozneje, bil je finalist slovenskega izbora za evrovizijskega mladega glasbenika leta 2014. Obenem je zmagal na nekaterih mednarodnih tekmovanjih v Požarevcu, Beogradu, na radijskem tekmovanju Concertino Praga, kjer je prejel tudi posebno nagrado za najboljšo izvedbo obvezne skladbe. V sezoni 2013/14 je bil sprejet v poletno šolo Evropskega mlađinskega orkestra in se je letos udeležil Evropskega glasbenega kampusa s sedežem v Avstriji.

Mladega umetnika vabijo k sodelovanju slovenski in nekateri tudi orkestri, nastopa pa tudi kot solist in v komornih sestavah. Z bratom Mihaelom nastopa tudi kot Duo Mitev.

Pianistka **Helena Kosem Kotar** je korepetitorka in profesorica klavirja na Konservatoriju za glasbo in balet v Ljubljani. Na ljubljanski Akademiji za glasbo je diplomirala v razredu Hinka Haasa, pozneje je opravila magisterij specialne didaktike klavirskega pouka in specializacijo pri Hinku Haasu.

Eva Tomšič was born in Ljubljana in 1995. She began studying the harp at the age of six, with teacher Lučka Joksić at Koper Music School. On enrolling at the Arts Gymnasium in Koper she continued her training with Anja Gaberc. Since 2013 she has been studying harp with Jana Boušková at the Royal Conservatory of Brussels in Belgium. She has won numerous prizes and gold plaques at regional, national and international competitions. In April 2013 she won first prize at the Svirél International Music Competition in the plucked instruments category. Her most recent success came at the

TEMSIG (Young Musicians of Slovenia) competition in 2015, where she won first prize and the special Ljubljana Festival and Slovene Philharmonic Orchestra award. At the end of this year she will take part in an international competition in Israel that is considered one of the most prestigious harp competitions in the world.

Eva regularly attends masterclasses with renowned teachers and maintains an active schedule of concerts. In December 2013 the international jury of the World Harp Congress selected her to perform a solo concert as part of the Focus on Youth programme at the 12th World Harp Congress in Sydney, Australia in July 2014. She has also performed in the United Kingdom, Serbia, Italy, France, Belgium and Croatia.

Eva Tomšič is also a member of various orchestras and has played under numerous renowned conductors.

Currently a fourth-year student at the Ljubljana Conservatory of Music and Ballet, **Luka Mitev** was born in Postojna in 1997 and is following in the footsteps of his father, the renowned bassoonist Zoran Mitev, who was also his first teacher. At the age of twelve Luka was already performing as a soloist with the Logatec Wind Orchestra. In 2010 Luka won a gold award at the regional TEMSIG competition and a gold plaque and first prize at the national competition, repeating the feat at the national TEMSIG competition three years later. In 2014 he was a finalist in the national selection for the Eurovision Young Musicians competition. He has also won first prizes at international competitions in Požarevac and Belgrade and at the Concertino Praga International Radio Competition for Young Musicians, where he also won the special prize for the best performance of the compulsory piece.

In the 2013/14 concert season he was selected to join the European Union Youth Orchestra's summer school and this year he attended the European Music Campus in Austria. He has been invited to perform with a number of orchestras in Slovenia and abroad and also performs as a soloist and in chamber ensembles. He and his brother Mihael also perform together as the Mitev Duo.

Pianist **Helena Kosem Kotar** is a répétiteur and professor of piano at the Ljubljana Conservatory of Music and Ballet. After graduating from the Ljubljana Academy of Music, where she studied under Hinko Haas, she completed a master's degree in piano teaching and a specialisation with Hinko Haas.

Kontrabassist **Todor Marković** je rojen leta 1997 v Postojni in je trenutno študent 3. letnika Akademije za glasbo v Ljubljani v razredu svojega očeta Zorana Markovića. Najprej se je učil violončelo, pri trinajstih letih pa je začel igrati kontrabas in opravil sprejemni izpit na Konservatoriju za glasbo in balet v Ljubljani. Kmalu se je udeležil več tekmovanj ter prejel leta 2013 zlato priznanje in drugo nagrado na državnem tekmovanju TEMSIG in prvo nagrado na Tekmovanju godalcev v srbskem Nišu. Kot eden najmlajših je leta 2013 in 2014 uspešno opravil avdicijo v Mladinskem orkestru Evropske unije. Nastopil je v koncertnem ciklu Dobimo se na Magistratu, kot član ansambla kontrabasov Bass Chorus je koncertiral na Nizozemskem, v Italiji in Srbiji. Krstno je izvedel noviteto skladatelja Štefana Maurija na Noči slovenskih skladateljev. V letošnjem letu je ponovno prejel zlato priznanje in prvo nagrado na tekmovanju TEMSIG, po uspešno opravljeni avdiciji pa se je kot najmlajši član

udeležil spomladanske in poletne turneje prestižnega Mladinskega orkestra Gustav Mahler ter sodeloval z Orkestrom Festivala Maribor.

Stefan Pajanović je bil rojen leta 1996 v Ljubljani. Klavir je začel igrati pri petih letih. Po zaključku nižje glasbene šole in diplomi na Konservatoriju za glasbo in balet pravkar začenja študij na ljubljanski Akademiji za glasbo v razredu Jasminke Stančul. Svoje klavirsko znanje je do sedaj izpopolnjeval na seminarjih in poletnih glasbenih šolah pri priznanih in svetovno uveljavljenih pianistih in pedagogih, kot so Konstantin Bogino, Claudio Martinez Mehner, Ruben Dalibaltayan in Jasminka Stančul. V času šolanja se je udeležil več mednarodnih in državnih tekmovanj, bodisi kot solist ali pa v komornih zasedbah.

Med njimi so mednarodno tekmovanje Ars Nova Trst, kjer je leta 2006 prejel zlato priznanje in prvo nagrado, leta pozneje na istem tekmovanju enako nagrado, 2013 je prejel zlato priznanje na državnem tekmovanju TEMSIG, večkrat pa je bil dobitnik priznanj in nagrad tudi na mednarodnem tekmovanju Euritmia v italijanskem Povolettu. Letos je na mednarodnem tekmovanju Memorial Jurica Murai v Varaždinu prejel srebrno priznanje.



Jana Fridau (1995) se je kitaro začela učiti v Glasbeni šoli Gornja Radgona pri Mariji Purnomo, kasneje pa jo je poučeval Samo Ismajlovič. Šolanje je nadaljevala na Konservatoriju za glasbo in balet Maribor pri profesorju Sašu Lamutu.

Študij kitare trenutno nadaljuje na Akademiji za glasbo v razredu profesorja Andreja Grafenauerja. Udeležila se je že številnih državnih in mednarodnih tekmovanj. Na tekmovanju TEMSIG je dvakrat prejela srebrno plaketo, leta 2008 pa je s kitarskim duom prejela zlato plaketo, letos še zlato plaketo in prvo nagrado. Na mednarodnem tekmovanju Ithaka v Ljubljani je leta 2007 dobila zlato priznanje in prvo nagrado. Velikokrat je sodelovala tudi na Morskem festivalu kitare, kjer je večkrat prejela zlato priznanje, leta 2014 pa še zlato priznanje na Dnevih kitare Krško.

Double bassist Todor Marković was born in Postojna in 1997 and is currently a third-year student at the Ljubljana Academy of Music, where he is studying under his father Zoran Marković. Having begun with the cello, at the age of thirteen he switched to the double bass and passed the entrance examination for the Ljubljana Conservatory of Music and Ballet. He was soon taking part in competitions and in 2013 he won a gold award and second prize at the National TEMSIG (Young Musicians of Slovenia) competition and first prize at the International String Competition in Niš (Serbia). In 2013 and 2014 he was one of the youngest musicians to pass the audition for the

European Union Youth Orchestra. He has taken part in the »Dobimo se na Magistratu« cycle of concerts in Ljubljana and has performed as a member of the double bass ensemble Bass Chorus in the Netherlands, Italy and Serbia. He gave the premiere performance of a new composition by Štefan Mauri at the Slovene Composers' Night event. This year he once again received a gold award and won first prize at TEMSIG. Following a successful audition, he took part in the spring and summer tour of the Gustav Mahler Youth Orchestra, as the youngest member of this prestigious ensemble. He has also worked with the Maribor Festival Orchestra this year.

Stefan Pajanović was born in Ljubljana in 1996. He began playing the piano at the age of five. Following his early training at lower music school and having completed a diploma at the Conservatory of Music and Ballet, he has now enrolled at the Ljubljana Academy of Music, where he is studying under Jasminka Stančul. He has attended seminars and summer schools taught by world-renowned pianists and established teachers such as Konstantin Bogino, Claudio Martinez Mehner, Ruben Dalibaltayan and Jasminka Stančul. He has also taken part in several international and national competitions, both as a soloist and with chamber ensembles. These include the Ars Nova International Music Competition in Trieste, where he won a first prize and gold medal in both 2006 and 2007. In 2013 he received a gold award at the national TEMSIG competition. He has also won several awards and prizes at the Euritmia International Young Musicians Competition in Povoletto, Italy. This year he won a silver award at the Tribute to Jurica Murai International Piano Competition in Varaždin, Croatia.

Jana Fridau (1995) had her first guitar lessons at Gornja Radgona Music School with Marija Purnomo, before going on to study with Samo Ismajlovič. She continued her training under Sašo Lamut at the Maribor Conservatory of Music and Ballet. She is currently studying under Andrej Grafenauer at the Ljubljana Academy of Music. She has already taken part in several national and international competitions. She has twice won a silver plaque at the TEMSIG (Young Musicians of Slovenia) competition, while in 2008 she won a gold plaque in the guitar duo category. This year she won a gold plaque and a first prize. In 2007 she won a gold award and first prize at the Ithaka International Competition for Young Musicians in Ljubljana. She has taken part in several editions of the Morski Festival Kitare, a guitar festival in Murska Sobota, and won several gold awards. In 2014 she won a gold award at the Guitar Days Festival in Krško.

Angažiran je bil pri izvedbi Mozartovega Rekviema, pri Bachovih Pasjonih po Janezu in Mateju ter v Stabat Mater J. Haydna v Salzburgu, Bonnu, Heilbronnu in Frankfurtu. Nastopil je že v operah Seviljski brivec, Don Juan, Pepelka, Figarova svatba in Beg iz Seraja. V Sloveniji je prvič nastopil decembra 2014 z orkestrom Nova filharmonija, januarja 2015 pa je debitiral v Frankfurtski operi.

Hidayet Djeddikar se je rodil v Baslu, odrasčal je v Bonnu, kjer se je poleg klavirja učil violinu, blokflavto in oboe. Odločil se je za študij klavirja in ga uspešno opravil na Visoki šoli za glasbo v Frankfurtu pri profesorju Herbertu Seidlu. Anna Magdalena Kokits, rojena leta 1988 na Dunaju, je danes ena najobetavnnejših pianistk v Avstriji. Leta 2013 je diplomirala na Dunajskem konservatoriju v razredu Alejandra Geberovicha in po zmaga na avstrijskih in mednarodnih tekmovanjih se je hitro uveljavila na pomembnih koncertnih odrih. Poleg uspešnih solističnih nastopov na priznanih

festivalih v Avstriji, Švici, Italiji, na Nizozemskem, v Nemčiji in Grčiji je kmalu odkrila še ljubezen do komorne glasbe. Med letoma 2007 in 2014 je s čelistom Alexandrom Gebertom redno nastopala v dvorani Dunajskega glasbenega združenja. Kot dokument njunih nastopov je letos izšla zgoščenka.

Anna Magdalena Kokits se posveča klasični in sodobni glasbi, pri čemer tesno sodeluje s priznanimi skladatelji, kot so Richard Dünser, Tomasz Skwerves, Helmut Schmidinger, Thomas Larcher, Christoph Renhart in Lukas Haselböck.

Njeno posebno zanimanje velja neznamim in pozabljenim delom. Trenutno za založbo Capriccio prvič snema celotni opus za klavir judovsko-avstrijskega skladatelja Ernsta Tocha (1887–1964) ter sodeluje pri snemanju za zgoščenko, posvečeno Mieczysławu Weinbergu (1919–1996).

The Austrian-Slovene bass-baritone **Philipp Kranjc**, born in Salzburg in 1991, began his musical training in his native city. Following voice study with Martha Sharp at the Mozarteum in Salzburg and masterclasses with Judith Lindenbaum and Thomas Heyer, he is currently studying under Thomas Heyer at the Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst in Frankfurt. He has appeared as a soloist in performances of Mozart's Requiem, Bach's St John Passion and St Matthew Passion and Haydn's Stabat Mater in Salzburg, Bonn, Heilbronn and Frankfurt. He has also appeared in the operas the Barber of Seville, Don Giovanni, Cinderella, The Marriage of Figaro and The Abduction from the Seraglio. He performed in Slovenia for the first time in December 2014 with the Nova Filharmonija. In January 2015 he made his debut at the Frankfurt Opera House.

Hidayet Djeddikar was born in Basel and grew up in Bonn, where in addition to the piano he studied violin, recorder and oboe. Having decided to focus on the piano, he went on to study under Herbert Seidel at the Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst in Frankfurt. Today he works as official accompanist at music competitions in Frankfurt, Pörtschach am Wörthersee and Vienna and teaches accompanist/répétiteur techniques at the Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst in Frankfurt.

Anna Magdalena Kokits, who was born in 1988 in Vienna, is today considered one of the most promising pianists in Austria. After graduating from the Vienna Conservatory in 2013 in the class of Alejandro Geberovich and winning a number of Austrian and international competitions, she soon gained recognition on important concert stages. Kokits gave a number of well received performances at respected festivals in Austria, Switzerland, Italy, the Netherlands, Germany and Greece, before then discovering her love for chamber music. During the period 2007–2014, she performed regularly with cellist Alexander Gebert at the hall of the Vienna Musikverein. A CD was released to document their path.

She focuses on classical and contemporary music and works with respected composers, such as Richard Dünser, Tomasz Skwerves, Helmut Schmidinger, Thomas Larcher, Christoph Renhart and Lukas Haselböck. However, unknown and forgotten works occupy a special place in her mind. She is currently recording the entire opus for piano by Ernst Toch (1887–1964), a Jewish Austrian composer, the first person to do so, and she is also working on a CD dedicated to Mieczysław Weinberg (1919–1996) for the Capriccio label.

Grega Rus, rojen leta 1994, je študent drugega letnika oddelka za godala na ljubljanski Akademiji za glasbo. Lani je prejel zlato plaketo na tekmovanju Svirél, letos pa prvo nagrado in zlato plaketo na tekmovanju TEMSIG. Ta priznanja so nadaljevanje prejšnjih, ki se vrstijo že od leta 2012, ko je bil prav tako prvonagrajenec in dobitnik posebne nagrade za najbolje izvedeno obvezno skladbo. Aprila 2013 se je udeležil mednarodnega tekmovanja godalcev v Nišu in v svoji kategoriji prejel prvo nagrado. Je tudi nosilec Škerjančeve nagrade, ki jo najbolj nadarjenim dijakom podeljuje Konservatorij za glasbo in balet v Ljubljani. Od letošnjega leta mladi umetnik igra v duu s sestro, pianistko Nadjo Rus, je tudi član kvinteta kontrabasov Bass Chorus, po potrebi igra v Orkestru Slovenske filharmonije, Simfoničnem orkestru RTV Slovenija pa tudi v Komornem godalnem orkestru Slovenske filharmonije in v Orkestru Festivala Maribor.

Leto starejša od brata Gregorja je **Nadja Rus**, ki je študentka tretjega letnika Akademije za glasbo v razredu Hinka Haasa. V letih 2004 in 2006 se je udeležila mednarodnega tekmovanja pianistov Concorsi di Musica della Val Tidone v Italiji, kjer je obakrat prejela bronasto plaketo in tretjo nagrado. V letih 2006 in 2007 je na mednarodnem tekmovanju v Trstu prejela srebrno plaketo. Isto leto je na regijskem tekmovanju mladih glasbenikov okolice Ljubljane in Zasavja dosegla prvo mesto in zlato priznanje ter na poznejšem državnem tekmovanju srebrno plaketo. Enako priznanje je prejela leta 2010.

Od leta 2010 Nadja Rus sodeluje v klavirskem duu s pianistko Nežo Koželj. Leta 2011 sta na državnem tekmovanju TEMSIG osvojili zlato plaketo, prvo nagrado in priznanje za najboljšo izvedbo slovenskega skladatelja. Lani sta na istem tekmovanju osvojili enako priznanje. Septembra letos sta kot solisti nastopili z Orkestrom SNG Maribor in izvedli koncert za dva klavirja Francisa Poulenca.

Nadja se redno udeležuje tudi mednarodnih poletnih šol in seminarjev pri priznanih klavirskih pedagogih.



Rannveig Marta Šarc je bila rojena leta 1995 v Ljubljani. S širimeti leti se je začela učiti violinino v glasbenem ateljeju Tartini pod mentorstvom Vildane Repše. Leta 2006 se je preselila v Reykjavík na Islandijo. Tam se je vpisala v glasbeno šolo Reykjavík College of Music in se na različnih tečajih izpopolnjevala pri priznanih violinistih, kot so Gregorij Kalinovski, Pinhas Zukerman, Patinka Kopec, Mimi Zweig in Ilya Kaler.

Rannveig Marta je prejela vrsto nagrad, denimo na mednarodnem tekmovanju Mladi virtuozi v Zagrebu, tekmovanju mladih glasbenikov TEMSIG in tekmovanju mladih solistov v organizaciji Islandskega simfoničnega orkestra. Kot solistka je sodelovala že z Islandskim simfoničnim orkestrom, orkestrom glasbene šole Reykjavík College of Music, v začetku prihodnjega leta pa jo čaka solistični debi z Orkestrom Slovenske filharmonije, s katerim bo izvedla Koncert št. 1 za violinino in orkester Sergeja Prokofjeva.

Šarčeva je tudi navdušena komorna glasbenica in je sodelovala na številnih mednarodnih tečajih, kot so Akademija Branimir Slokar, Program za mlade umetnike v Ottawi, na Mednarodnem inštitutu, ki nosi ime po legendarnem violinistu Heifetzu, trenutno pa študira violinino pri Laurie Smukler na sloviti šoli Juilliard v New Yorku.

Grega Rus, born in 1994, is currently a second-year student in the Strings Department at the Ljubljana Academy of Music. Last year he won a gold plaque at the Svirél International Music Competition, while this year he took first prize and a gold plaque at the TEMSIG (Young Musicians of Slovenia) competition. Earlier successes at

the same competition include a first prize and a special prize for the best performance of a compulsory piece in 2012. In April 2013 Grega took part in the International String Competition in Niš, winning first prize in his category. He is also a winner of the Škerjanec Prize, awarded by the Ljubljana Conservatory of Music and Ballet to the most gifted students. This year he began performing as a duo with his sister, the pianist Nadja Rus, and he is also a member of the double bass quintet Bass Chorus. He has played with the Slovene Philharmonic Orchestra, the RTV Slovenia Symphony Orchestra, the Slovene Philharmonic String Chamber Orchestra and the Maribor Festival Orchestra.

A year older than her brother Grega, pianist **Nadja Rus** is currently a third-year student at the Ljubljana Academy of Music, where she is studying under Hinko Haas. In 2004 in 2006 she took part in the Concorsi Internazionali di Musica della Val Tidone in Italy, on both occasions receiving a bronze plaque and third prize. In both 2006 and 2007 she won silver plaques at an international competition in Trieste. That same year she took first place and a gold award at the regional TEMSIG competition for the Ljubljana and Zasavje region, before going on to win a silver plaque at the national competition, a feat she repeated in 2010. Since 2010 Nadja Rus has been performing in a piano duo with Neža Koželj. In 2011 they won a gold plaque, first prize and a prize for the best performance of a piece by a Slovene composer at the national TEMSIG competition. They repeated their success at last year's competition. In September this year they appeared as soloists with the Orchestra of the Slovene National Theatre Maribor and performed Francis Poulenc's Concerto for Two Pianos and Orchestra. Nadja Rus regularly attends international summer schools and seminars with renowned piano teachers.

Rannveig Marta Šarc was born in Ljubljana in 1995. She began studying the violin at the age of four at the Tartini Music Studio with teacher Vildana Repše. In 2006 she moved to Reykjavík (Iceland), where she enrolled at the Reykjavík College of Music and attended masterclasses and courses by renowned violinists such as Grigory Kalinovsky, Pinchas Zukerman, Patinka Kopec, Mimi Zweig and Ilya Kaler.

She has won numerous prizes, for example at the international Young Virtuosi competition in Zagreb, Slovenia's national TEMSIG competition and the competition for young soloists organised by the Iceland Symphony Orchestra.

As a soloist she has played with the Iceland Symphony Orchestra and the orchestra of the Reykjavík College of Music and is due to make her solo debut with the Slovene Philharmonic Orchestra early next year, with a performance of Prokofiev's Violin Concerto No. 1. Relatively few works have been written for the combination of harp and guitar, so they expand their repertoire with transcriptions of a wide variety of pieces. Last year they won second prize at the IV Concurso Ibérico de Música de Cámara con Arpa in Madrid and third prize at the fourth edition of the international Suoni d'Arpa competition in Salsomaggiore, Italy. This year they won a special prize at the seventh Svirél International Music Competition: the opportunity to perform a concert at the Young Virtuosi Cycle. The two musicians are very active as soloists and as a duo both in Hungary and around Europe, where they garner excellent reviews and are praised for their musicality, freshness and keen sense of musical detail. They invite listeners into their world of sound and musical imagination and share it with them.

Dragan Ribić was born in Bosanski Petrovac in 1989. After studying the accordion under Danijela Gazdić at the Sarajevo Academy of Music, he enrolled at the Hochschule für Musik in Detmold, where he is currently studying with Grzegorz Stopa. Since 2002 he has won numerous prizes and awards both at home and abroad, among them the second prize at an international competition in Greece, second prize at the 8th International

Accordion Competition in Poprad, Slovakia, the special prize of the Sparda-Bank Foundation in Hanover, first prize at the Svirél International Music Competition, to mention only the most significant.

Leta 2011 je bil eden od desetih izbranih pianistov za festival Music Academy of the West v Santa Barbari (Kalifornija).

Njegov repertoar sega od baroka do sodobne glasbe s posebnim poudarkom na jazzu in sorodnih stilih.

Časopis The Cincinnati Enquirer je o izvedbi zapisal: »Cossijeva tehnika in nadzor nad zvokom sta osupljiva. Igral je v razkošnem, orkestrskim tonom, kljub temu pa ni nikoli pozabil na pretanjenošč.«

Pihalni kvintet Anemos je nastal leta 2008, ko se je pet mladih furlanskih glasbenikov odločilo, da se skupaj spopadejo z bogato literaturo za to zasedbo od 18. stoletja do dandanes.

V sedmih letih obstaja se je ansambel predstavil na nekaterih pomembnejših koncertih v Italiji in Sloveniji. Glasbeniki so namreč varovanci našega odličnega glasbenika Paola Calligarisa, člana pihalnega kvinteta Slowind in prvega fagotista v Orkestru Slovenske filharmonije.

Umetniška pot jih je vodila na pihalni festival Guido Cantelli v Novaro, na mednarodni festival Nei suoni dei luoghi v Furlaniji, igrali so v vatikanskem muzeju in na pomembnejših koncertnih prizoriščih

v Furlaniji - Julijski krajini. Kvintet je dobilnik prve nagrade na 3. nacionalnem tekmovanju za pihalne ansamble v mestu Bertiolo in prve nagrade na tekmovanju Svirél v Štanjelu na Krasu s posebno nagrado žirije. Prejeli so drugo nagrado na nacionalnem tekmovanju v Piove di Saccu in tretjo nagrado na mednarodnem tekmovanju Lilian Caraian v Trstu.

Vseh pet glasbenikov je sodelovalo ali pa še sodeluje v različnih orkestrih, kot so Accademia della Scala v Milatu, Orkester gledališča La Fenice v Benetkah, Italijanski mladinski orkester, Orkester Fundacije Opere Giuseppe Verdi v Trstu, Celovški simfonični orkester, Orkester gledališča v Cagliariju, pri Cameristih Triestinah, Orkestru Haydn v Bolzanu.

Repertoar pihalnega kvinteta Anemos vsebuje skladbe Haydna, Christiana Bacha, Mozarta, Danzija, Beethovna, Reiche, Debussyja, Iberta, Milhauda, Hindemitha, Bozze, Mahlerja, Ligetija, Rote in drugih.

Sebastian Bertoncelj, born in 1992, is the son of one of the finest pianists Slovenia has ever produced, the late Aci Bertoncelj. He began studying the cello in Domžale with Zdenka Kristi Marinič. Since 2006 he has been a student of Miloš Mlejnik at the Ljubljana Academy of Music. He has also studied with Conradin Brotbek in Stuttgart and Christian Polterá in Lucerne and attended the masterclasses of Heinrich Schiff, Philippe Muller, Antonio Meneses, Gal Faganell and others.

He has successfully participated in several competitions, both at home and abroad. He has won first prizes at competitions in Gorizia, Trieste and Vipiteno and a third prize at the Armin Kaufmann Competition in Austria. He is also a three-time first prize winner at the national TEMSIG competition in Slovenia.

Sebastian appears regularly on concert platforms at home and abroad, and at music festivals, where he performs either as a soloist or with orchestras.

He is also a keen chamber musician. In 2014 he won first prize and the highest score at the TEMSIG competition with the piano trio Aeternum. To date the trio has performed in Slovenia, Italy, Austria, Switzerland and Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Among the musicians he has worked with are his teacher Miloš Mlejnik, Boštjan Lipovšek, Wonji Kim Ozim, Dalibor Miklavčič, Johannes Kropfitsch, Wolfgang Davide, Klaus Maetzel and members of the Slovene Philharmonic Orchestra.

In 2011 Sebastian Bertoncelj received the Škerjanec Prize of the Ljubljana Conservatory of Music and Ballet. Two years later he won the Student Prešeren Prize of the Ljubljana Academy of Music.

Lorenzo Cossi was born in Trieste, where he studied at the Conservatory of Music under Giuliana Gulli before going on to study with other notable teachers such as Nino Gardi, Eliso Virsaladze, Joaquín Achúcarro, William Grant Nabore and Jerome Lowenthal. He has also attended the International Piano Academy on Lake Como and the Accademia Chigiana in Siena.

In 2011 he was one of ten pianists selected to take part in the Music

Academy of the West summer festival in Santa Barbara, California. His repertoire extends from baroque to contemporary music, with a particular emphasis on jazz and related styles. His enthusiasm for chamber music has led him to work with noted musicians such as Johannes Moser, Federico Agostini, Geoff Nuttal and Amanda Roocroft.

He has won prestigious international competitions such as the Rina Sala Gallo International Piano Competition in Monza and the Giuliano Pecar International Piano Competition in Gorizia, among others. He has twice been a finalist at the Ferruccio Busoni International Piano Competition in Bolzano. He was recently one of five finalists at the Honens International Piano Competition in Calgary (Canada), where he gave a notable performance of Brahms's First Piano Concerto with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, conducted by Roberto Minczuk. The Cincinnati Enquirer wrote: »Cossi's technique and command of sonority were simply stunning. He produced lush, orchestral sounds and performed amazing feats, but always with a refined touch.«

The Anemos Wind Quintet formed in 2008 when five young musicians from Italy's Friuli region decided to dedicate themselves to the exploration of the rich repertoire for wind ensembles from the 18th century to the present day. Over the course of the last seven years the quintet has performed in several important concerts in Italy and Slovenia. The members of the quintet are protégés of Paolo Calligaris, a member of the Slowind Wind Quintet and first bassoon of the Slovene Philharmonic Orchestra.

Their artistic journey has taken them to the Guido Cantelli Wind Festival in Novara, the international Nei Suoni dei Luoghi Festival in Friuli, the Vatican Museum and several important concert venues in Friuli-Venezia Giulia. Accolades to date have included a first prize at the 3rd International Competition for Wind Ensembles in Bertiolo, Italy; a first prize and special jury prize at the Sviréž International Music Competition in Štanjel, Slovenia, a second prize at the Concorso Nazionale di Esecuzione Musicale Città di Piove di Sacco, and a third prize at the International Lillian Caraian Chamber Music Competition in Trieste.

All five members of the quintet have played in or are currently members of various orchestras, including the Orchestra dell'Accademia Teatro alla Scala in Milan, the Orchestra del Teatro La Fenice in Venice, the Italian Youth Orchestra, the Orchestra of Fondazione Teatro Lirico Giuseppe Verdi in Trieste, the Klagenfurt Symphony Orchestra, the Orchestra del Teatro Lirico di Cagliari, the Cameristi Triestini and the Haydn Orchestra in Bolzano.

The repertoire of the Anemos Wind Quintet includes works by Haydn, Johann Christian Bach, Mozart, Danzi, Beethoven, Reicha, Debussy, Ibert, Milhaud, Hindemith, Bozza, Mahler, Ligeti, Rota and others.

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
